Development of the HPH Global Strategy 2016-2018

The objective of the HPH Global Strategy 2016-2018 is to provide a shared platform and direction for the work of the HPH members, National/Regional HPH Networks, HPH Task Forces and the HPH Governance Board for the period 2016-

The HPH Global Strategy 2016-2018 has been developed by the HPH Governance Board and the International HPH Secretariat in 2014-2016. The development was based on workshops and discussions at the 20th and 21st meeting of the HPH General Assembly in Barcelona 2014 and in Oslo 2015. A draft of the Strategy was further discussed at the 22nd HPH General Assembly in New Haven 2016, and input and feedback have also been included in the strategy. The strategy follows the HPH Constitution and includes the updated WHO Standards and Self-Assessment Forms for implementing health promotion in hospitals and health services.

Design and use

The Global Strategy is a working tool for National/Regional Networks, individual HPH members, HPH Task Forces, and the HPH Governance Board.

The individual HPH members is a new category in the HPH Global Strategy 2016-2018. Previously, the individual member hospitals and health services were included in the strategy for N/R Networks, but as many individual members have asked for guidelines and input on how and what to works towards, the individual HPH members have been given their

For each of the four groups, the Global Strategy provides a list of specific activities and related goals for the work and development for the period 2016 – 2018. The idea is to provide the four groups with a list of tangible, easy-to-assess activities and goals.

The HPH Global Strategy 2016-2018 is categorised into three overall priorities:

Priority 1: Implementation of Updated WHO Standards

The WHO Standards & the WHO Manual and Self-Assessment Forms for implementing health promotion in hospitals has been a key tool for the HPH member hospitals and health services since 2006. WHO Regional Office for Europe and the WHOC-CC for Evidence-Based Health Promotion in Hospitals & Health Services in Copenhagen have in collaboration worked on an awaited updated version of the Standards and self-assessment forms, and the implementation of the new updated standards has therefore been given top priority in this strategy.

Priority 2: HPH Awareness and Capacity

It has been prioritised to bring more attention to the international HPH Network and the substantial work and projects ongoing in the network. Prioritising awareness and capacity aims at identifying key persons, roles, and tools for making the HPH Network better known locally, regionally and internationally.

Priority 3: HPH Development and Sustainability

Priority three aims at maintaining, advancing and improving the international HPH Network. The goals are to develop and disseminate information as well as furthering knowledge about the HPH Network. A focus on enhancing the number of HPH member hospitals and health services world wide has also been given priority.

For all three priorities, a special attention to the exchange of knowledge and experiences are highlighted.

International Network of Health Promoting Hospitals and Health Services (HPH)

Constitution

PREAMBLE

The International Network of Health Promoting Hospitals and Health Services was initiated by the World Health Organization to put into action the WHO principles of health promotion, which concern patients, staff, community and the environment of hospitals and health services. The Network has now come to a stage of sustainability enabling it to become a legal entity and a main partner for collaboration with WHO.

Through this Constitution, the International HPH Network states its purpose and objectives, describes the rules for decisions for statutory bodies as well as the relationship with its members and international partners.

Article I NAME, AIMS,

Mission 1.

The Health Promoting Hospitals and Health Services of the International Network shall work towards incorporating the concepts, values, strategies and standards or indicators of health promotion into the organizational structure and culture of the hospital/health service. The goal is better health gain by improving the quality of health care, the relationship between hospitals/health services, the community and the environment, and the conditions for and satisfaction of patients, relatives and staff.

The International Network of Health Promoting Hospitals and Health Services, hereafter referred to as the International HPH Network, follows the principles of WHO regarding health promotion as written down in the Ottawa Charter (1986), the Budapest declaration (1991), the Vienna recommendations (1997), the Bangkok Charter (2006) and the Standards for Health Promotion in Hospitals (2004). The International HPH Network will collaborate with international organizations such as European Commission and WHO to support the implementation of health promotion strategies, e.g. Patient Safety (2004) and Prevention and control of non-communicable diseases in the WHO European Region (2006).

2. **Purpose**

The International HPH Network shall promote and assist the dissemination of the concept of health promotion in hospitals and health services (as defined in the mission above) and support implementation within countries and regions, internationally, through technical support to members and the initiation of new national / regional networks.

3. Objectives

- To provide leadership on matters critical to health promotion in hospitals and health services and engaging in partnership where joint action is needed
- To shape the research agenda and stimulate the generation, translation and dissemination of valuable know-
- To set norms and standards and promote and monitor their implementation
- To articulate ethical and evidence-based policy options
- To provide technical support, catalyse change and build sustainable institutional capacity
- To monitor the development of health promotion in hospitals and health services
